Code of Conduct

Parents & Carers

- Encourage your child to learn the rules and play within them;
- Discourage unfair play and arguing with officials;
- Help your child to recognise good performance, not just results;
- Never force your child to take part in sport;
- Set a good example by recognising fair play and applauding the good performances of all;
- Never punish or belittle a child for losing or making mistakes;
- Publicly accept officials' judgements;
- Support your child's involvement and help them to enjoy their sport;
- Encourage and support your child's coaches and managers, e.g. by accepting and supporting team and group selections.
- Use correct and proper language at all times;
- Ensure your child brings a drink to training & matches.
- Follow the procedures below for Junior Training Nights & Matches

Training Nights

- Try to park away from the club e.g. in Bloomfield Drive and walk to the club. (This avoids congestion in the Bloomfield Rise cul-de-sac)
- Bring your child(ren) to the registration point which is next to the clubhouse. Ensure that they have registered and have paid (£3 if not paid in advance) before you leave them.
- Neither children nor parents should go onto the square (the cut square shaped part in the middle of the ground).
- No hard balls or bats to be used before the session starts.
- There will be no practice if it is wet, if in doubt telephone the club (01225 837100) or Jon Solly (07813) 122160.
- Parents should collect their children from the registration point.

Matches

- All matches start at 6 pm, Players should arrive by 5.45, or earlier if requested by the coach.
- For home matches, try to park away from the club e.g. in Bloomfield Drive and walk to the club. (This avoids congestion in the Bloomfield Rise cul-de-sac)
- For away matches note that the club does not provide transport - parents must arrange that.
- Ensure your child is registered with the coach or manager.
- Please assist in any way you can. e.g. by scoring, umpiring, looking after club kit, serving on the bar & making tea coffee for home matches.
